The book of Revelation is an interesting piece of literature, and in spite of what we have heard about it, it speaks more about its recent past than any future event. Rather than being interested in what is going to happen, it speaks powerfully and eloquently, about what has already happened.

That in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ ... everything has changed.

Revelation is written as the Roman Empire rules the known world. Likenesses of Roman gods and goddesses are everywhere, their practises and influence fill the skies, rivers and land with their sacrifices, incense offerings, their temples are a presence on every corner.

The ruler of all these gods, is the Eagle ... the First among men ... the God, Caesar ... the Roman Emperor.

But the book of Revelation suggests that a new way of looking at things has arrived. That the world's winners ... are not necessarily God's winners. God's winner here is not the Eagle, but the Lamb ... the Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered.
